



ITINERARY: 4 DAYS - 3 NIGHTS Sunday to Wednesday (Nauta - Nauta)

Day 1 - Sunday

Iquitos / Nauta / Amazon River

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| 08:30hrs | Meet and greet at Iquitos Airport by <i>La Perla</i> crew. |
| 10:00hrs | 1.5 hour bus transfer to Nauta, to our private pier, where we board the boat |
| 12:00hrs | Check in to the cabins |
| 12:30hrs | Lunch on board.
Brief orientation about the journey. while the ship starts sailing down the Marañon River to the confluence of the Marañon and Ucayali River, which is where the Amazon River starts. |
| 14:30hrs | Excursion into the Amazon birthplace |
| 15:30hrs | Boat excursion looking for wildlife into the Communal Reserve of Yanayacu of Yacapana, located into the Yarapa river.
(The Yanayacu de Yacapana River, is home to the <i>San Juan de Yanayacu</i> community who are among the few remaining descendants of the Kukama-Kukamiria) |



Flora and fauna includes Giant water lilies, iguanas, sloths, beautiful pink dolphins and many bird species.

- 17:30hrs Return to the Ship
- 18:00hrs Lecture by our naturalist guides
- 19:00hrs Reception with Live Music on board.
- 19:30hrs Dinner on board.
- Overnight in the Amazon River

Day 2 – Monday

Pacaya Samiria National Reserve

Amazon River /Yarapa River / Ucayali River

- 06:00hrs Early wake up call.
- 06:30hrs Birdwatching excursion into the Yanayacu of Yacapana Communal Reserve, to see macaws, sloth, monkeys, toucans, flycatchers, trogons, parakeets and more.
Yacapana Islands Exploration and Dolphin watching
- 08:00hrs Breakfast on Board. We turned to sail up The Amazon River to Ucayali River.
- 09:30hrs Morning Boat excursion to explore tributaries. Into Yarapa River looking for wildlife
- 12:30hrs Lunch on main boat.
- 15:00hrs Geographical orientation and short talk about the amazon by the naturalist on board.
- 16:30hrs Visit to the butterfly farm project of Vista Alegre Communal Reserve. We will learn about Amazon butterflies and their importance to the rainforest.
- 18:00hrs Back to the ship.
- 18:30hrs Reception with Live Music on board.
- 19:30hrs Dinner.
- 21:00hrs Optional night boat excursion to search for caimans, snakes, tarantulas, scorpions, anacondas, night monkeys and much more.



Day 3 – Tuesday

Ucayali River / Marañon River / Pacaya Samiria National Reserve

- 06:00hrs Wake up call.
- 06:30hrs Get ready to go into The Black Yarapa River. We will search for wildlife and enjoy spectacular views of the forest. We explore the river hoping to spot squirrel monkeys, woolly monkeys, black collared hawks and kingfishers, among many others.
- 08:00hrs Breakfast on board. We keep sailing down the Ucayali, to the confluence of the Amazon, and up the Marañon River.
- 09:30hrs Boat ride along Piranha Creek one of the first tributaries of the Pacaya and Pacaya Samiria National Reserve. in search of wildlife.
- 12:30hrs Lunch on board.
- 15:30hrs Jungle walk in a Communal reserve, learning about medicinal plants, searching for insects, tarantulas, frogs and learning basic survival in the forest with our expert naturalists.
- 17:30hrs Return to the Ship
- 18:00hrs Lecture by our naturalist guides
- 19:00hrs Reception with Live Music on board.
- 19:30hrs Dinner on board

Day 4 – Wednesday

Nauta / Iquitos

- 07:00hr Breakfast on board.
- 08:30hrs Check-out and bus transfer from Nauta to Iquitos.
- 09:30hrs Visit the Manatee Rescue Center en route to Iquitos.
- 10:30hrs Brief city tour around Iquitos to see the famous houses dating from the Rubber Boom era, such as the Iron House, Belen Market and more.
- 11:30hrs Arrive at Iquitos Airport to board your outgoing flight.



Included

- Transfer Iquitos Airport/ Nauta/Iquitos Airport - recommended flights
- Overnight aboard the M/V La Perla Cruise.
- All meals whilst on board.
- Bottled water and non-alcoholic house beverages.
